
Another thing I just learned. A lodge in Poland that, before the war in Ukraine,

### Seven Stars Inn 2d. Street Baltimore, Maryland

The birthplace of American Odd Fellowship. After a few men responded to an ad in the Baltimore American newspaper by an outgoing blacksmith Thomas Wildley and two friends who similarly missed the fraternal companionship. The ad announced the meeting which would be at 7pm on April 2, 1819 at the Seven Stars Tavern located on the south side of Second Street (now Water Street), between Frederick St. and what was then called Market Place, basically where Baltimore City Community College now stands. Washington Lodge was subsequently organized on 26 April 1918.


# NEWS FROM THE ACTIVITY DEPARTMENT

I am sure you have all heard by now that we have been enjoying Americas National Guard in our building. They are here to work as Nursing Assistants and trying to help us with the staff shortage. I am a patriot to the core so welcoming these wonderful young people into our home has been nothing short of amazing!

They arrived on January 20<sup>th</sup> and there are 10 of them. They had a rather quick, intense training and set to work with our staff. A few bumps in the beginning but these young men never intended to do the type of care required of a nurse aide. They did a beautiful job, and we are very grateful. Below are some of the comments I have heard on the units:

- One of our guardsmen is so pleased that a resident on the C wing calls for him each day and allows only him to provide his morning care. Both the resident and the Guardsman are rewarded by this experience
- We have a woman in our facility that does not talk to anyone! She has been "chewing the ear off" one of the guardsmen in the corridor telling him where to find the best restaurants in Green Bay. She is totally open to him and he is wonderfully attentive to her.
- After morning care was completed, 2 guardsmen and their instructor gave a massage and foot care to a very grateful woman.
- There is a lift in the air that is contagious, and I am hoping my staff feel the sense of honor and learning from these young men. There is humor and work ethic that is accompanying them that I pray remains.

I wish we could bottle the energy and teach the world that a positive approach does make a difference!

# TO BE READ IN ALL LODGES:

The Odd Fellow Rebekah Home Association Inc has proposed the following changes to the by-laws of the Association:

Sec. 15.13. Number, Tenure and Qualifications. There shall be eight **ten (10)** Directors, including the Grand Master by virtue of office, and seven **nine (9)** Directors consisting of four **five (5)** Rebekahs and three **four (4)** Odd Fellows, who need not be delegates to the session. Odd Fellow and Rebekah members shall be elected for a three-year term, with the term of **at least** one Director from each unit of the Order to expire each year. This provides for continuity of the Board. Each director shall hold office until his/her successor has been elected and qualified.



# MISTY'S Recipe Exchange

Cheese Steak Quesadillas

Servings: 4 Difficulty: easy

#### Ingredients

- 1 lb beef sirloin steak, cut in thin strips
- 1 bell pepper, sliced
- 1 onion, sliced
- 2 teaspoon Lawry's Seasoned Salt, divided
- 1 teaspoon McCormick Montreal Steak Grill Mates Seasoning
- 1 teaspoon pepper, divided
- 16 slices provolone cheese
- 4 large flour tortillas
- canola oil
- non-stick cooking spray

#### Directions

For the steak-combine the sliced steak, 1 teaspoon season salt, steak seasoning, and 1/2 teaspoon pepper in a ziplock bag. Mix until the seasoning has evenly coated the steak. Heat 1 tablespoon of oil in a cast iron skillet over medium high heat. Sear sliced steak in batches for 1 to 2 minutes per side depending on how done you like your steak. Do not over crowd the pan. Add 1 tablespoon of oil if the pan gets to dry. Remove steak from pan. Heat 1 tablespoon oil over medium heat in same skillet. Toss in sliced onion and bell pepper. Sprinkle with 1 teaspoon season salt and 1/2 teaspoon pepper. Saute veggies for 5 minutes or until tender, stirring frequently.

Now assemble the quesadillas. Heat large skillet or griddle on medium high heat. Spray with non-stick cooking spray. Place flour tortilla on pan. Lay 4 slices of Provolone cheese evenly on the flour tortilla. On one side, top with steak. On the opposite side, top with the sauteed peppers and onion. Once the cheese has melted, fold the flour tortilla in half. Remove from the skillet and cut into 4 wedges. Eat and enjoy!
