

Spring has finally arrived!





The meeting was called to order at 7:57 a.m. The opening prayer was given by Char

Everett.

Report from Stephenson National Bank

Jeff Bauman reported that 2022 was a very tough year for the financial markets. Both stock and bond values were negatively affected which is unusual. In a balanced portfolio, the usual

reaction is if one goes up, the other goes down. Bond rates dropped 13% and large cap U.S. stocks dropped 18%. Currently, money market accounts are paying over 4% which makes cash holdings more attractive. The fact that interest rates were already at zero

left the Fed little choice but to raise interest rates to try to curb inflation. The only slightly positive areas were cash and oil companies.

Our Trust managers are focusing on less risk. They are basing their decision-making on these areas.

- 1. Inflation the economy is transitioning from purchasing goods to purchasing services. It is anticipated that goods inflation will decrease while services and wage inflation will stay high.
- 2. Stock market outlook a slight recession that is neither too deep or too long lasting is anticipated in late 2023 and 2024.
- 3. Eastern threats: the war in Ukraine will result in higher energy costs and lower earnings. China reopening after their Covid shutdowns will affect the demand for and cost of raw materials and oil prices.
- 4. The United States has focused on an international supply chain and it will be difficult to bring production back to the U.S. We are energy independent, but we will have supply chain issues.
- 5. In January SNB has outperformed their benchmarks showing recovery from the underperformance in 2022. Managers are favoring tech companies like Amazon because they have reduced their labor force, invested in their infrastructure and built in automation.
- 6. Jeff noted that historically, down years are usually followed by years of positive growth. The managers are looking at long term patterns to be poised to take advantage of those opportunities in the future.
- 7. The attitude of the fed has changed over the last couple of years. In early 2022, the fed believed that inflation would be short-lived and rate hikes would be unnecessary until 2023. During 2022 it became apparent that they needed to do something and raised interest rates several times in the amount of 16 quarter-point rate hikes which came much faster than any previous rate hikes. This has no historic precedent.





- 8. Internationally, the global leading economic indicators of service and manufacturing trends show a slowing of growth in all world economies. Even Japan has raised interest rates, something they have never done. In some countries, the economies are slowing so fast that they are moving toward recession.
- 9. Unemployment is very low. The Fed wants to see unemployment around 5%. Demographics are changing. Baby boomers who were large consumers of goods are retiring and purchasing less and doing less. Fewer workers will demand more, and the quality of goods and services will likely be poorer than in the past. A company, like OFH, that is labor-intensive will have difficulty finding employees.
- 10.Northeast Wisconsin typically grows slower, there are fewer people, and population growth is slower than the rest of Wisconsin. SNBT has been advising business owners to look at automation to bridge the gap. It will be too costly to bring people back to get the business going.
- 11. SNBT managers are starting to look at global real estate because real estate prices have declined significantly. There is likely to be a shift back to working in offices at some point when that becomes less costly than working from home. It is too early to do this now, but the possibilities might be there in the future. There is a cycle of employment: During a recession, the employers have the power. During better times, the employees have the power.



An important factor with our relationship with SNBT is that our account is compliant with our investment policy.

A motion was made by Jeff Jones and seconded by Tami Adams to approve the minutes of the October 22, 2022. Minutes were approved.

A Thank You note was received from Char Everett in gratitude for the gifts of a plaque, a bonus, the trust the Board placed in her in her position as CEO and the Board members' friendship. The location of the next Board meeting will be returning to the board room at Friendship Place. The next meeting will be on April 29, 2023. There will be electronics available that we don't have at Comfort Suites unless we rent them. Dan-a has plans to project slides as she gives her presentation to the Board. Dan-a will arrange for breakfast and lunch.

Operational Review of OFRHA

- 1. The CFO (Chief Financial Officer) position has been retitled to Finance Director to better reflect the requirements of the position, doing the work as well as supervising other employees. The search has begun with a 3-step interview process: screening phone interview (13 applicants), in person interview of 4 candidates with Dan-a, the business office staff and the new administrator, and then two of those candidates had a virtual video interview with Amy from CLA. The focus will be on the individual's background in finance and experience with the needs of a skilled nursing facility. Dan-a gave a brief overview of each of the candidates qualifications. She hopes to have Amy's recommendations this weekend or early next week, with a possible start date of March 1.
- 2. Al had invited CLA to come in to help him get his work caught up. In a conversation with Amy, Dan-a agreed if CLA would give her a report on their findings. There are two facets to this. One is a virtual consultant for 40 hours per week and an onsite consultant for 20 hours per week. The onsite person will help with the year end financial reports and the audit and will stay on to help with the transitions to the new Finance Director and with the new financial (GLAP) computer systems.






3. A new financial system will be installed in place of the current Melix system as soon as the 2022 financial reports are finalized. The SAGE system is user friendly and has more technical components that will allow for easier reporting. It is also less expensive and will save time for the financial person.



4. Policies were presented for approval: Safety First Program, the Patient Protection Program and Coronavirus Prevention and Control. These are tied to the QAPI program. The Safety program, the Patient Protection program and QAPI are three of the required programs for nursing homes, in addition to the Corporate Compliance Policy. Dan-a gave an overview of each of the policies. She is still waiting for a response from DHS to verify if all volunteers must undergo a background check which is \$10.00 per person. These must be repeated every four years. All staff members must go through background checks and LIG certification from the Office of Inspector General on a monthly basis plus two references upon hiring and an annual performance evaluation, in addition to continuing education on stress management. There is also a procedure for internal and external reporting of events with a time frame for reporting and following up, so if an event occurs, there is a trail of the event. Jeff moved and

Tami seconded to give interim approval to all three policies to be acted upon at the next meeting. Motion adopted. 5. A consultant was brought in to increase the effectiveness of the DON and ADON. She was able to help them increase their effectiveness with the staff. She also helped update our

coronavirus policy and work with the infection preventionist to increase her understanding of the requirements of her job. The public health emergency around COVID is expected to end in April and the COVID policy will then become part of the pandemic plan which is similar to the influenza plan. The DON and ADON have been educating the staff on the infection control policy.



Operational Revue of Rebekah Haven

- 1. No COVID outbreak. It was confined to OFH.
- 2. Census is full.
- 3. No current staff openings, except for a night shift casual call position.

Operational Review of Odd Fellow Home

- 1. Census is running between 58 and 60. Part of this is a staffing issue which has been addressed by the consultant
- 2. The consultant met with Dan-a to discuss ways of increasing the census.
- 3. Dan-a is attending 3 job fairs: February 22, March 1, and April. They are being held at the local colleges: UW-GB, NWTC, and UW-O. She is also using various job websites to try to find more, qualified applicants. Dan-a and Kate, the Director of Marketing and Admissions, have been attending the job fairs together.
- 4. The consultant worked with the DON to help her make the best use of her staff within the constraints of the budget.
- 5. Dan-a is working to give an attendance bonus of \$2.00 per hour, in place of a shift differential beginning March1. If at any time during a pay period an individual calls in, is late to work, or leaves early without permission, the individual loses the bonus. This will be evaluated for its effectiveness.
- 6. Dan-a is expecting the state surveyors to come within the next week or two.



7. A new hospital (a surgical center with outpatient and overnight) is coming to Green Bay, next to Aurora. Kate has been actively engaging with them to get another referral source for rehab patients. She has also met with the case managers from Prevea and Bellin.



- 8. The marketing pamphlet has been updated. Pictures are from 2022 rather than much earlier.
- 9. Part of the information being given out at the job fairs focuses on the Odd Fellow and Rebekah organizations and the educational opportunities they provide.



10.Dan-a also plans to get into the high schools and their education fairs as a means to grow interest in the nursing home and the Odd Fellow and Rebekah organizations.



11.Dan-a is hopeful that, with the hiring of a new NHA, she will be able to get into the community to grow interest in our nursing home facility.



12.A new social worker, who has a MSW degree, will begin on Monday. This will allow us to continue with interns from UW-GB. Part of Phase 3 requires the facility to have a dementia program and a behavior program. Danielle is qualified to help us develop these programs. Cody updated the Facility Assessment in 2022. This is something that is to be done annually. There are a few addenda that need to be made with the changes in staff.

13. Char questioned whether the water safety program for legionnaires disease had been reviewed. Dan-a reported that a Life Safety survey has just been completed to make sure everything is up to par.

14. All the items necessary for the surveyors to consider are slowly coming together.

15.Dan-a has a new puppy, a mini golden doodle, that was purchased for her daughter, but with the dual purpose of becoming a therapy dog for the nursing home residents.

Meeting recessed for a short break.



When the meeting resumed, Rich moved and Jeff seconded to allow Dale Stevenson to stay during the closed session. Motion carried.

The motion was made by Pat with a second by Jeff to close the open session and enter into closed session. Motion carried.

When the meeting returned to open session at 1:28 p.m., Tom moved to hold the next meeting at 8:00 a.m. on April 29, 2023, at the home. Seconded by Jeff. Motion carried.

It was decided to dissolve the board committee that was to meet monthly with Dan-a.

Tami moved and Loren seconded to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried. Respectfully submitted,
