GRAND CHAPLAIN'S LETTER

THE WISCONSIN ODD FELLOW

Human beings were created to be relational, and friendships are an important part of our lives. We need friends—people we bond with in mutual affection. But not just any friend will do; having the right friends is key, and discernment is required: "The righteous choose their friends carefully" (Proverbs 12:26). In Scripture, we see what a true friend should be:

A true friend shows love, no matter what (Proverbs 17:17).

A true friend gives heartfelt advice, bringing joy to the heart (Proverbs 27:9).

A true friend rebukes when necessary, but the correction is done in love

(Proverbs 27:5–6).

A true friend influences, enlivens, and sharpens (Proverbs 27:17).

A true friend avoid gossip (Proverbs 16:28).

A true friend forgives and does not hold grudges (Proverbs 17:9).

A true friend is loyal (Proverbs 18:24).

A true friend helps in time of need (Ecclesiastes 4:9–12).

Friends can console and help us when we are in trouble, as when Barzillai the Gileadite consoled David when he was being hunted by Saul (<u>2 Samuel 19:25–26</u>) or when Jephthah's daughter's friends consoled her in her sorrow (<u>Judges 11:37–38</u>). A friend may also rebuke in love, proving more faithful than a hypocritical flatterer (<u>Proverbs 27:6</u>).

One of the greatest biblical examples of friendship is <u>David and Jonathan</u>, son of King Saul. Jonathan's loyalty to his friend, David, exceeded that to his own father and his own ambitions (<u>1 Samuel 18:1–4</u>; <u>20:14–17</u>). So attached was David to his loyal friend that, after Jonathan's death, David wrote a song to him, a tribute filled with heart-wrenching pathos (<u>2 Samuel 1:19–27</u>). Theirs was a friendship closer than brotherhood.

Friendship can have its negative aspects as well. Supposed friends can lead us into sin, as when Jonadab counseled Amnon to rape his half-sister, Tamar (<u>2 Samuel 13:1–6</u>). A friend can lead us astray spiritually, as Israel was warned about (<u>Deuteronomy 13:6–11</u>). Even well-intentioned friends can provide false comfort and give bad advice, as Job's friends did, making his suffering worse and displeasing the Lord (<u>Job 2:11–13</u>; <u>6:14–27</u>; <u>42:7–9</u>). People we thought were friends can prove false, deserting us when our friendship no longer benefits them (<u>Psalm 55:12–14</u>; <u>Proverbs 19:4</u>, <u>6–7</u>). For all these reasons and more, friends should be chosen carefully.

The Bible gives warnings about the wrong types of friends. We are not to be friends with a hot-tempered person, for example (Proverbs 22:24–25). And Proverbs 1:10–19 and 4:14–19 warn against those who entice us to do wrong. We should not associate with evildoers, no matter how great the promised reward or how appealing their "friendship" seems to be. Those whose "feet rush to sin" should be avoided at all costs. The path they choose is no place for a Christian whose choice should be to follow the "path of the righteous." Only that path leads to friendship with God.



TO BE READ IN ALL ODD FELLOW, REBEKAH, & ENCAMPMENT LODGES

It was decided at our May Odd Fellow and Rebekah Museum Board meeting to conduct a fund-raising campaign. The funds will be used to replace the wood framed glass doors on the display cases in the museum. The present doors cast shadows on our artifacts and also take away about 25 sq. inches of display areas for each cabinet.

We will be replacing the wood framed glass doors with solid glass sliding doors, this will allow our artifacts to be kept more dust free, better protected and more visible.

The cost of each door will be \$365, to include the installation. We have 14 doors that need to be replaced. Six doors have already been donated. We need funds for 8 more to do this project. Your donations will be much appreciated.

Odd Fellow Rebekah Home Association Inc. Annual Home Association Meeting June 12, 2023 Comfort Suites

Home Board members present: Richard Proulx, president; Denise Olsen, secretary; Rich Smith, Tami Adams; Jeff Jones, Grand Master; Dale Stevenson, Ellen Tews, Loren Cunningham and new member Jody Tews. Member absent: Tom Heins, excused.

OFRHA member: Dan-a Kohn, CEO

President Dick Proulx called the meeting to order.

Dick updated members on some of the projects that have occurred at the Home during the past year. A new staff position of IT manager has been created to help bring us into the future with technology. He has completed an inventory of all the technology on campus. He is working on replacing the phone system, installing new data switches in the computer system, and updating the nurse call system. These should be completed later this year. Two new software systems are being installed. A record keeping system for patient records, Point-Click-Care, has been instituted which makes record keeping more efficient and much easier to find information when it is needed. This also serves to monitor that employees are working up to expectations. A new ledger system for processing financial information will be instituted in July.

A new home administrator, Justis Sutheimer, has been hired.

Dick also mentioned the difficulty in hiring enough staff so we can fully open to be able to increase our census. So far we are managing to stay afloat with income moving in the right direction.

Dick introduced the new Board member, Jody Tews and re-elected member Dale Stevenson.

Dick mentioned the complaint of some nurses against the ability of the CEO. The Board contacted a Human Resources attorney and hiring an HR consulting firm to check into the matter. According to the consultant, there

was nothing to substantiate the claim. The Board is very pleased with the work our CEO is doing. Dick introduced our CEO, Dan-a Kohn. She has been CEO for one year on

June 15. She gave a bit of background and explained that both she and her husband have joined the Green Bay Odd Fellow lodge and are active members. She is working hard to make the greater Green Bay community aware of Odd Fellow Home through rebranding the facility to make it more visible. She has reworked the logo, using the three links and the red, white

and blue Odd Fellow colors. New name badges for the staff have been created which can be made in-house at considerable savings. In the future it

is hoped to be able to use the badges as access to the building, instead of handing out keys. Generally, she is working to make things more user friendly, accessible and cost effective.











Dan-a led the way to switching to Point-Click-Care for patient records. It allows for keeping accurate patient records and allows for oversight of staff, providing the ability to know what kind of additional training staff members may need. It can help prevent costly re-hospitalizations. The goal is to provide the best quality of life for our patients as we can. We are focusing on psycho-social well-being, especially since Covid.

Dan-a has brought several new people into leadership roles with the hope that everyone will have the same goals. The first was the IT manager who has helped wherever he's needed. We have great tenure among the CNAs with some having over 30 years and an assistant activity director who was

employed for over 36 years. The changes in technology has been scary for several of the employees, but the issues are being worked through. Working with the HR consultant was challenging for Dan-a, but she gained some additional insight about working with the staff so things would go more smoothly. Dan-a is happy with the progress that is being made. The majority of technology changes will be completed by the end of summer.

The nursing home had a great state annual survey. There were a few relatively minor issues that were easy to fix. The survey was the first for our Director of Nursing and she did very well. Our new Home Administrator

places great importance on the employees and their families, believing if the workers are happy, the care of the patients will reflect that. The residents have expressed good feelings about their care.

Dan-a is participating in the Allouez Business Association meetings, in five job fairs in the community and partnering with all the local colleges for clinical experiences for nurses, RNs and LPNs, and CNAs. This gives us a way to get additional employees and to help our greater Green Bay community. Dick has a meeting with Dan-a every Thursday morning where he is learning things that can be brought back to the Board at its quarterly meetings. We have been able to gain solid leadership and entrance into modern record keeping which helps us satisfy the government requirements of keeping those records on any patient for ten years.

The census on campus: Rebekah Haven is full with a waiting list of 25. Odd Fellow Home is averaging about 55 to 60 out of the 88 licenses we hold. We are operating in the black because we are able to keep our expenses in check. We have been fortunate that we are able to staff the facility with our own staff; we don't need to use agency employees which costs two to three times what our own staff costs. By keeping our census at a level where our own staff can manage the care, we are being financially responsible. Employees can earn a bonus for a pay period if they do not call in an absence. We hold orientation sessions every other week. This past week, we had an LPN, a CNA and a hospitality aide, who is someone who is interested in becoming a CNA and for whom we will pay the tuition for schooling which is partially reimbursed by the state of Wisconsin. Additional information was given about how the CNA program works throughout the greater Green Bay area. Meeting adjourned.

Jody moved and Jeff seconded to pursue the annexation proposal from the Village of Allouez. Discussion followed. Motion carried.

The next meeting date will be Saturday, August 12, at 8:00 a.m., at Odd Fellow Home conference room. BSG will be catering our meal at their request.

Jody was welcomed as a new board member. The new vice president and secretary were welcomed to their positions.

Jeff moved and Tami seconded to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried.

Conceive, Believe, Achieve



To my Sisters and Brothers,

Greetings, this will be my last communication for the I.O.O.F. News as President-I.A.R.A. Traditionally the acceptance speeches are printed in the September-October issue. However, I had already submitted an article so I thought I would share some excerpts from my speech given last August at my Installation.

"It was exactly 30 years ago that I attended my first IARA Session. And, wouldn't you know, this first timer found herself heading up the flag corps - serving as the American flag bearer. I had no more idea what was in store for me in 1993 than I did 26 years later when I became International Warden. Maybe that's stretching it a little bit, but this experience has been so much more than I could ever have imagined. I tend to be pretty independent, but it sure is nice to be so well taken care of on my travels and where do you find better hostess's than Rebekahs? Thank you my friends.

In planning for my year, I thought long and hard about my program. Initially my emblem was to be the tree of life. That turned out to not be a good choice for me and after dismissing several other options, I chose to not have an emblem. For some reason our Rebekah Creed kept going through my mind. I am a Rebekah. I Believe in the Fatherhood of God, the Brotherhood of man and the Sisterhood of woman. I Believe in the watchwords of our Order, Friendship, Love and Truth. I Believe my main concern should be my God, my family, and my friends...then I should reach out to my community and the world. After considerable thought I decided I would just use a theme and it would be "**Believe**".

I have chosen to emphasize my theme with 4 foods for thought. They are: believe in God, believe in Miracles, believe in Yourself & believe in Odd-Fellowship. Odd Fellowship is one of the best kept secrets around. We, that includes me, do not talk enough about our affiliation with the Order. Share what you like best about being a member, let people know what you are doing as a lodge to benefit your community, let others know about our projects. Get the information in to your schools about the I.O.O.F. Pilgrimage for Youth and the many Scholarships and student loans that are available through the Educational Foundation. Let people know about the endowment that we have with Wilmer Eye Institute and how they could possibly benefit from the research being done there. Be proud of the work being done for Arthritis, SOS Children's Village in Cambodia, our Hunger and Disaster Fund, the Rose Parade Float and the Living Legacy Program among others.

We as members, have so much to be proud of and so much to share with others. For too many years we have lived by the lecture "when thou doest alms, let not thy left hand know what thy right hand doeth, that thine alms may be in secret". We cannot continue to be secretive if we are to survive. Become involved in your community. Take part in community programs and festivals. Prepare an entry in the local parade, attend village meetings, show interest in community events.

Make A Difference Day is a golden opportunity to plan community clean-ups or organize work groups to help disabled or elderly with spring yard work. Sponsor a little league team and attend their games – do not just buy tshirts and think they will remember who you are. Cheer them on! Talk to the parents and tell them about Rebekahs – try to pique their interest. There are potential new members everywhere. Let people know that Rebekahs are busy, caring, creative people. My aim for the year is "Get going, get growing. Believe in a fantastic tomorrow!"

I believe in you! Please believe in yourself! We can do this!

I worked in a bank for 24 years and for many of those years I had taped to my desk blotter a Prayer titled "Little Things". In closing, I would like to share it with you:

Lord, help me with the little things that I forget. Remind me of the compliment that I should give, the letter to the friend I miss, the kind word I meant to speak to someone sad.
