


GRAND SECRETARY'S LETTER

MUSEUM MEANDERING

When wandering around the Museum, there is so much to share with our members. What should we share next? Did you know that our museum building is the home of Wisconsin's first Encampment, the Wildey Encampment #1. It was instituted in the jurisdiction of Wisconsin during the time when Thomas Wildey was here to help lay the corner stone for the new lodge hall (present day museum) back in 1838. I wonder what became of that Encampment? The last



encampment in Mineral Point was Hudson Encampment which has been closed for many years.

The present Museum building was purchased by Grand Lodge in 1926. In search of more information, a letter was found addressed to Mr. J. M. Ostrander, Past Grand Patriarch of Wisconsin and Iowa Lodge #1 members. It is dated May 1, 1927 from J.D. James of Los Angeles, California. In his letter, he tells of being a young boy in Mineral Point in the 1850's. He attended school in the lodge hall due to an overcrowded public school. Class was held in the upstairs lodge room and was accessed through an exterior door leading to a set of stairs built on the west side of the building. Meals for the school children were served downstairs where Mrs. Weber, a widow, resided with her son. It is quite interesting when such findings are able tell the stories of the past.

In 1954, the Grand Lodge of Wisconsin purchased the piece of land to the east of the museum. The land was purchased from J. W. Skidmore, with the condition that said land be exclusively and remain forever a park for the use and enjoyment of the Grand Lodge's members and their successors. If the land were ever to be used for anything else the deed would become null and void!!

1954 was also the year for the very first "Pilgrimage" to the museum which at the time was called the **Odd Fellow Shrine**. Member of the Wisconsin Odd Fellows and Rebekah's from all over the state ventured each May to attend Shrine Day held in Mineral Point. It was a gala event. More to come next month, this museum is full of stories.

Greetings to all members, families and friends of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows. You are cordially invited to attend the Ninetieth Annual Independent Order of Odd Fellows Pilgrimage to the Tomb of the Unknowns. Members of all units of the Order are encouraged to participate. The Pilgrimage Committee is pleased to provide the following information about this annual event.

The 2024 Pilgrimage will take place on Sunday, May 5 at Arlington National Cemetery. The memorial services will begin at noon followed by the wreath laying ceremonies at the Tomb immediately after the 1 p.m. changing of the guard. *Please note the dates and times the program will be held.* The Pilgrimage address at the Tomb will be delivered by the Honorable John S. Cupp, Jr., Sovereign Grand Master.

The Hilton Alexandria Mark Center, at 5000 Seminary Road, Alexandria, Virginia 22311, will be our headquarters. Room reservations are to be made directly with the hotel, at toll-free 1-800-Hiltons (1-800-445-8667) or 1-703-845-1010. You MUST mention "Odd Fellows Pilgrimage" when reserving your room to receive the special rate of \$ 132 single/double, \$157 triple, and \$167 quad. All room rates are subject to applicable hotel tax. (See attached information about hotel accommodations).

The annual Pilgrimage banquet will be held in the hotel on Saturday, May 4, 2024, at 7 PM. (Advance ticket purchase required - see attached pre-registration form.) A social hour will be held from 5:45 PM to 6:45 PM. After the banquet, all present will have the opportunity to meet and greet the Honorable John S. Cupp, Jr., Sovereign Grand Master, Sovereign Grand Lodge from the Jurisdiction of Pennsylvania, Sister Ellen Jean Whited, President, International Association of Rebekah Assemblies from the Jurisdiction of New York, and General Howard G. Malin, General Commanding, General Military Council, Patriarchs Militant, from the Jurisdiction of Virginia.

We recommend that you schedule flights to and from Ronald Reagan National Airport (DCA), the nearest airport to the Hilton Alexandria Mark Center. The hotel no longer offers shuttle service. However, other transportation services are available from the airport. The Washington metro area is also served by Dulles International Airport (IAD), located 30 miles southwest of the Capital in Northern Virginia. I must write this column by October 15, so my testimonial has not yet happened nor have several fall visitations to Grand Lodges. Please keep this in mind, in case I seem to contradict or ignore something that happened in between my writing and your reading.

I hope you haven't received a snowfall yet. I have never been a fan of winter, and the older I get, the more I dislike winter. Try to look in on the sick and distressed when the weather turns cold and snowy. We are our brothers' keeper and should remember our obligation. If weather is going to shut you down, try to meet by ZOOM or some other internet communication.

As time passes, I will speak about different parts of my program. I am going to digress a moment and touch upon something else. While I was visiting the Grand Lodge of West Virginia, I was interviewed for an Odd Fellows podcast. I was asked a simple, but deep, question. That question was, "If you could do just one thing during your year as Sovereign Grand Master, what would it be?" I thought about the question for a minute and considered all the things I planned on doing and all the situations I had encountered in the 48 years I have been a member. I replied that it would be a mentoring program, where each new Odd Fellow would be paired with an experienced member who would guide the new member and assist in developing him or her as an Odd Fellow. We should take a look at the world we live in. Even after a lengthy education, we don't allow a new graduate to practice medicine without an internship. There is a gap between the time one takes the bar exam and a license to practice law is granted; that interim is often filled with a period working with another lawyer (this used to be mandatory in Pennsylvania). You are not allowed to enter a skilled trade without an apprenticeship. We are missing a critical step.

We have a number of books for new members and the ritual and other publications of The Sovereign Grand Lodge are quite useful. Most people will not look into books and do any kind of research. The new member needs a skillful brother or sister to take him or her to meetings, explain what is going on and show them the true meaning of "Friendship, Love and Truth." I sit in sessions in many jurisdictions and the Grand Lodges are all closed "Sine Die." Do we ever explain any of this? Sine Die is a two-word phrase in Latin. It has several acceptable pronunciations, / sinə 'dēə, sēnā 'dēā/ quoted here from Google. It means without a time set for resumption. This is one phrase we should explain to the members, perhaps at the close of each Grand Lodge. There are a few secrets in our Order, but too many things have been kept secret from our members.

We see two different approaches to degree work. Some lodges confer the degrees in a lodge meeting, on one or two candidates. More often, all the degrees are conferred in the same day at a degree rally. It is when the latter form is employed that we need to be vigilant and explain things in

greater detail. Few people retain more than 20% of what point, we need to foster a scholarship of our Order they have been taught for any length of time. The reinforcement of meetings and observation of conferrals is the best way to educate the new member through repetition. When I was young, we were taught multiplication tables. We memorized that 7 times 7 equals 49. Memorization is an old tool that works wonders. Watching and listening make better teaching tools than reading a book. Books can't stop and answer questions.

You notice I used the term "conferral" when referring to degrees. We confer degrees, we do not "put them on." I have the eyes of age and the words on the pages of the ritual sometimes seem a bit hard to read, this is why we need to read them and hear them over and over. We open and close our lodge each meeting night. New members should attend with a mentor who can explain the degree work to him or her.

The story of the good Samaritan is found in Luke 10: 29 -37. "To explain the origins of the Samaritans, we must go back to the days of the kings. After King Solomon ruled over the Israelites - God's people - the unwise actions of his son Rehoboam in the tenth century BC led to a schism in which the kingdom was split into the northern kingdom of Israel and the southern kingdom of Judah, each with its own king."

"Both kingdoms devolved into corruption and sin, despite repeated warnings from prophets sent by God. Thus, God warned, they would be overtaken by conquerors. The northern kingdom fared worse than the southern kingdom, with a long line of wicked rulers. It didn't help that the temple, where God's people were to worship, was located in the southern kingdom."

"In 721 B.C., the northern kingdom of Israel fell to the Assyrians. Many of the people of Israel were led off to Assyria as captives, but some remained in the land and intermarried with foreigners planted there by the Assyrians. These half-Jewish, half-Gentile people became known as the Samaritans." (Quoted from Bible Study Tools, 10/18/23, URL: https://

www.biblestudytools.com/bible-study/topical-studies/ the-samaritans-hope-from-the-history-of-a-hatedpeople.html.)

As I go through my term, I will provide background for much of our customs and usages and try to enrich your knowledge of our Order. Getting back to my original


through mentoring new members. Take the hand of a new member, be a friend and teach him or her about our wonderful Order.

No Bake Pumpkin Lush

This Pumpkin Lush is going to be your new go to Fall dessert. A cinnamon graham cracker crust is topped with a creamy layer before a luscious pumpkin layer and topped with whipped cream. This is a no bake dessert and perfect for all the holidays.

PREP TIME

30 minutes

4 hours

TOTAL TIME 4 hours 30 minutes

Ingredients

- 1¹/2 cups crushed cinnamon graham crackers
- 6 tablespoons butter, melted
- 1 (8 ounce) block cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1 (8 ounce) containers whipped topping
- 12 ounces evaporated milk
- 15 ounce pumpkin puree
- 1 (5.1 ounce) instant vanilla pudding
- 1 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice



- 1. In a bowl combine the crushed graham crackers and melted butter.
- 2. Press the graham crackers into the bottom of a 9x9 pan.
- 3. In a medium mixing bowl combine the softened cream cheese and powdered sugar with an electric mixer.
- 4. Fold in one container of whipped topping.
- 5. Spread the cream cheese mixture onto the crust carefully.
- 6. Next in a medium mixing bowl using an electric mixer combine the evaporated milk, pumpkin puree, instant pudding and pumpkin pie spice.
- 7. Spread the pumpkin mixture over the cream cheese mixture.
- 8. Top with the remaining whipped topping.
- 9. Refrigerate for 4 hours before serving. You can also freeze this, just let it thaw for 30 minutes before serving.
- 10. Garnish with some crushed graham crackers and cinnamon.
