
TO BE READ IN ALL ODD FELLOW LODGES: GRAND MASTER'S LETTER



2021. They are Emily Cody of Mineral Point and Brooklyn VanNatta of Lancaster.










NEWS FROM THE CEO AND ADMINISTRATOR

I sent an article out once before, a very long time ago about being prepared for winter conditions. I think it is worth doing again this time of the year. According to the news I listen to, we are living with record breaking cold and windy conditions. So, I am sending this to remind you to be careful, be aware of your surroundings, and let someone know where you are going and about when you will be back.







Know your risk

tips to help keep you safe this winter:

Check the forecast before you leave the house. Familiarize yourself with winter watches, warnings, and advisories so you know what to do when one is issued in your area. A few inches of snow can leave you stranded or trapped at home for days. Frostbite may develop on exposed skin in minutes when the temperature dips below freezing and when you add wind – even quicker. Know the symptoms of hypothermia and get help if you are suspicious of having them.

Take Action

Make sure you have an emergency supply kit in your home and in your vehicle. If possible, avoid leaving home in hazardous weather. If you must leave, make sure you are dressed for the elements and that your phone is fully charged. Wear loose warm clothes in layers and have food, water, and a blanket in your car that is easily accessible. It can be very dangerous to leave your vehicle to open the trunk for a blanket – keep it on the back seat! Remember, your pets are cold also. Keep them in a warm place.

Be prepared to be home!

Have a supply of necessary items in the event you cannot leave your home safely.

Food, water, blankets, flashlights, etc. are all important but be sure to keep your eye on your medication and try not to get down to a single dose left before you refill.



Be a Force of Nature

Set an example and others will follow. Call friends, family, and neighbors to alert them and then to check on them. Offer assistance where you can, especially to the elderly who are particularly vulnerable

Winter weather can be deadly but with a few short steps you can stay safe! I am sending you a chart of symptoms and tips for cold weather hazards. Remember, we love you, we need you, and we want you safe and healthy!

Hypothermia	*Shivering *Confusion *Memory loss *Slurred speech *Drowsiness	Body temperature that is too low (below 95 de- grees)	*If body temp is below 95 degrees seek immediate medical attention *Move into a warm room *remove wet clothes *Warm the center of your body first
Frostbite	*redness or pain *white or grayish yellow skin *numbness	Freezing of body parts exposed to cold	*move to a warm room *do not walk or use frostbitten body parts *warm the area by submerging in warm water *do not massage, use heating pads, lamps, stoves, or fires to warm the area.




The icicles on the sides and front under the polar bear and penguins are white mum tops.

The sled was orange and yellow corn flower petals. The three links inside the sled were white dry beans, blueberries, and Cranberries.











Easy Tomato Soup Recipe

This easy tomato soup is the perfect quick and easy lunch or dinner. To make it, you just need one can of tomatoes, a handful of pantry staples, and less than half

an hour

Ingredients

Special Equipment

- Immersion blender OR
- · Countertop blender

Tomato Soup for Two

- 1 tablespoon (14g) butter
- ½ cup diced onion
- · 2 cloves garlic minced
- · Pinch of red pepper flakes optional
- 1 14-ounce can tomatoes whole, cubed, or crushed
- ¾ cup chicken broth or water
- 3 tablespoons heavy cream
- · Salt and pepper

Instructions

- 1. In a medium saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Add onions and cook until softened, 5 to 7 minutes.
- 2. Add garlic and red pepper and cook for 30 seconds.
- 3. Add tomatoes. If using whole tomatoes, crush with a spoon and simmer for 10 minutes to soften. If using diced tomatoes, simmer for 5 minutes. If using crushed tomatoes, continue to next step.
- 4. Add broth. Bring to a simmer, and cook for 15 minutes. Remove from heat.
- 5. If using an immersion blender, blend soup until mostly smooth. You may need to tilt the pot for the blender to work effectively. If using a countertop blender, cool the soup for 10 minutes before transferring it to the blender and blend until smooth or mostly smooth. If soup is too thick, you can blend in a little more broth or water. Return to saucepan.
- 6. Stir in cream and salt and pepper to taste. Reheat over medium heat if necessary and enjoy!
