Preserving Our Future

Few of us in the Independent Order of Odd Fellows interact with the Grand United Order. Even fewer are aware of what happened to the Grand United Order in 2022 when a member filed a copyright on the ritual and other intellectual property of the Grand United Order, making their property his personal property. Because the GUOOF was not vigilant in protecting their intellectual property they lost control of it. This should be a stern, immediate warning to our Order to take every necessary precaution to safeguard our ritual and other intellectual property.

Currently our intellectual property is managed by the Sovereign Grand Lodge via the office of the Sovereign Grand Secretary. We place many demands on our Secretary, including management of the use and ownership of our intellectual property. With the significant workload we already expect of the position, it's wise to consider moving management of our intellectual property to a specialist who would not only be able to consolidate all our intellectual property, but also use it to promote Odd Fellowship. Having a professional manage our intellectual property will make it easier to monitor its use and find copyright violations more quickly before they can do damage to our reputation.

I am a professional musician by trade. Unless people know that I'm around and available for gigs, I don't get hired and don't make money. The same is true of plumbers, carpenters, electricians, and all sorts of tradesmen and small businesses. Without promotion, nobody knows to hire them or buy their products. The same is true of Odd Fellowship. Unless people know that we still exist, they're not going to join our lodges. The message most commonly spread in the mainstream media is that Odd Fellowship is dead. Every time an episode of "American Pickers" shows artifacts from a lodge, they always refer to our lodges as having closed and our Order as having existed in the 19th Century. We need to counter that message by letting the public know that we still have thousands of lodges that still exist and are welcoming new members. In an earlier era, sharing that message might have meant a big, expensive blanket advertising campaign with radio and TV commercials and print ads in newspapers and magazines. A cam-

any particular demographic, spreading our message to no one in particular. Now, however, with social media, it's possible to tailor our message to a very specific group of people and send it out to just that group.

The last four or five years have seen an increase in interest in Odd Fellowship as demonstrated by the new lodges chartered in jurisdictions like British Columbia, Wyoming, Montana, California, New York, New Jersey, Louisiana, Texas, Oregon, Virginia, and various overseas destinations. There are also efforts underway to organize new lodges in places like Georgia, Florida, Minnesota, and Nevada. That dramatic increase in interest in Odd Fellowship is no accident; it correlates with the recent increase in members who are creating and promoting media content about Odd Fellowship. There have been multiple books published, podcasts created, social media networks launched, and all kinds of posts across Instagram, Reddit, Twitter, and Facebook advertising Odd Fellowship to the world. With a professional branding and marketing campaign which uses social media effectively we can use that dramatic increase in member creativity to help share our message that Odd Fellowship is vital and growing and is the place for young people to find the kind of fellowship and meaning so many are actively looking for in life.

One of the dangers of not having a branding and marketing campaign is that other people who are not knowledgeable about Odd Fellowship or don't have our best interests at heart can spread a false narrative about Odd Fellowship without any challenges to their validity. Already there are conspiracy theorists making videos on YouTube claiming that our orphanages in the 19th Century were built for various nefarious purposes. The only way to effectively counter that kind of false information online is to make sure that we are regularly creating positive, factual content about Odd Fellowship which will create a positive image of Odd Fellowship for the world.

- 1 lb ground beef
- 1/3 cup tomato sauce
- 5-6 leaves of basil
- 1 1/2 tsp oregano
- Salt
- · Fresh cracked black pepper
- 3/4 to 1 lb dry farfalle pasta
- 1 1/2 cups shredded Cheddar-Jack cheese mix

Instructions

- 1. Cook pasta according to the package directions, drain and set aside.
- 2. Preheat oven to 350 and lightly grease a casserole dish. (2 1/2 3 quart baking dish will work.)
- 3. Slice onions and peppers thin.
- 4. Preheat a large cooking pan over medium heat. Add some vegetable oil, onions and peppers. Cook veggies until softened.
- 5. Add ground beef to the pan. Break it up as much as possible, cover, and cook for a few minutes. Stir well breaking up clumps of beef. Add tomato sauce, salt and pepper. Mix and continue to cook, covered, until beef is done.
- 6. Stir in oregano and chopped basil. Stir in pasta and transfer the mixture into a prepared baking dish.
- 7. Spread shredded cheese all over the top and bake for 15-17 minutes.
