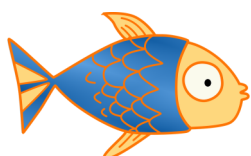

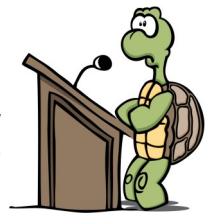
March is Arthritis Month. Please try to have a fundraiser for this disease that many of us suffer with. One that has worked in many jurisdictions is collecting from each member the

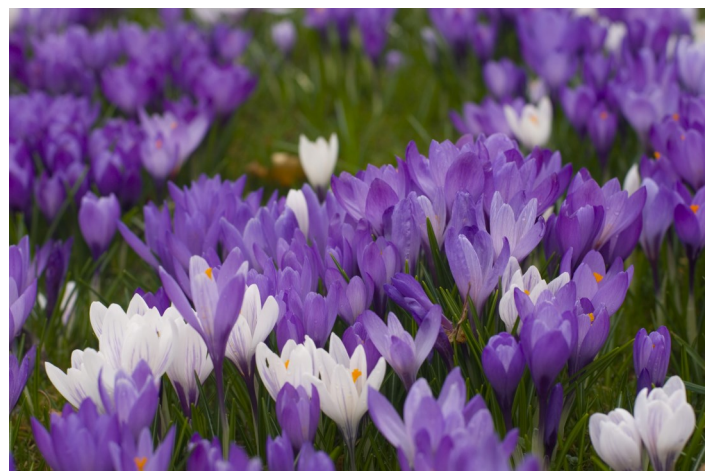

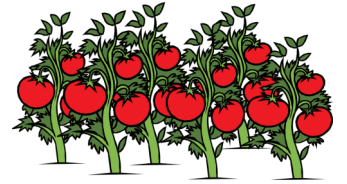

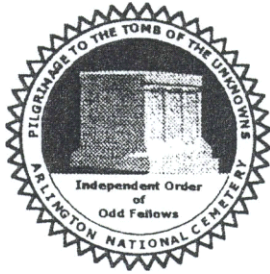

Greetings to all members, families and friends of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows. You are cordially invited to attend the Eighty-eighth Annual Independent Order of Odd Fellows Pilgrimage to the Tomb of the Unknowns. Members of all units of the Order are encouraged to participate. The Pilgrimage Committee is pleased to provide the following information about this annual event.

The 2022 Pilgrimage will take place on Sunday, May 8 at Arlington National Cemetery. The memorial services will begin at **noon** followed by the wreath laying ceremonies at the Tomb immediately after the 1:00 p.m. changing of the guard. ***Please note the dates and times the program will be held this year.*** The Pilgrimage address at the Tomb will be delivered by the Honorable Charles E. ‘Chuck’ Lusk, Sovereign Grand Master.

The Hilton Alexandria Mark Center, at 5000 Seminary Road, Alexandria, Virginia 22311, will be our headquarters. Room reservations are to be made directly with the hotel, at toll-free 1-800-Hiltons (1-800-445-8667) or 1-703-845-1010. You **MUST** mention “Odd Fellows Pilgrimage” when reserving your room to receive the special rate of \$125 single/double, \$140 triple, and \$150 quad. All room rates are subject to applicable hotel tax. (See attached information about hotel accommodations).

The annual Pilgrimage banquet will be held in the hotel on Saturday, May 7, 2022, at 7:00 PM. (Advance ticket purchase required - see attached pre-registration form.) A social hour will be held from 5:45 PM to 6:45 PM. After the banquet, all present will have the opportunity to meet and greet the Honorable Charles E. ‘Chuck’ Lusk, Sovereign Grand Master, Sovereign Grand Lodge from the Jurisdiction of Ohio, Sister Kathleen D. ‘Kathy’ Richen President, International Association of Rebekah Assemblies from the Jurisdiction of Massachusetts, and General Michael L. Bowers, General Commanding, General Military Council, Patriarchs Militant, from the Jurisdiction of Tennessee.

We recommend that you schedule flights to and from Ronald Reagan National Airport (DCA), the nearest airport to the Hilton Alexandria Mark Center. Hotel shuttle service may or may not be available depending on Covid restrictions that may be in place in May. Taxi service is available. The Washington metro area is also served by Dulles International Airport (IAD), located 30 miles southwest of the Capital in Northern Virginia. (There is no free hotel shuttle from this airport.) Please note the event could be cancelled at the last minute by the military; therefore, travel arrangements should be made accordingly. In addition, masks will be required for all events.

The hotel will accept reservations **on a space available basis after April 7, 2022, but not at this reduced price**. It is imperative that reservations are made as early as possible. 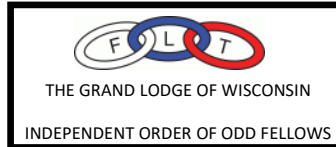

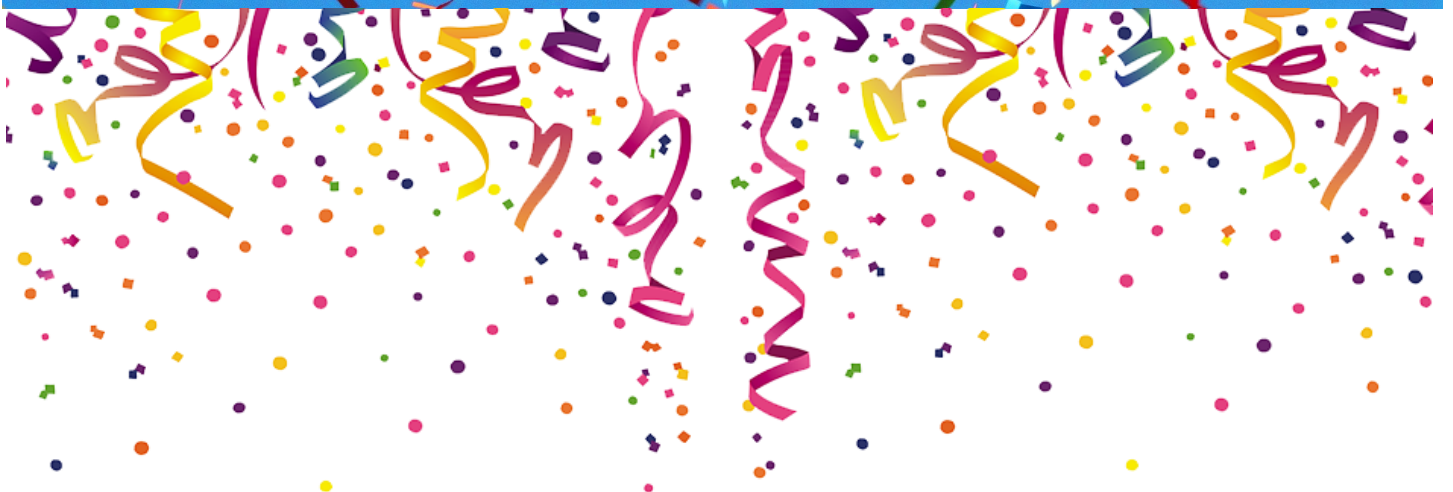

- 1 Ready Made Graham Cracker Pie Crust

- 8 oz Frozen Topping thawed
- 1 tsp Mint Extract
- 6 drops Green Food Coloring

Instructions

1. In a large bowl, combine pudding mix and milk.
2. Whisk until dissolved and starting to set.
3. Add mint extract and whisk until blended.
4. Add whipped topping and food coloring.
5. Fold in to incorporate.
6. If color is too light add one additional drop at a time.
7. Spread mixture into pie shell and refrigerate at least two hours.
8. Garnish as desired.



Slow Cooker Corned Beef and Cabbage

Equipment

- 8 quart Slow Cooker

Ingredients

- 3 to 4 lb. corned beef, with seasoning
- 4 cups low sodium beef broth
- 2 bay leaves
- 1 lb. baby carrots
- 2 lbs. baby potatoes, red and gold
- ½ head cabbage, chopped

Instructions

1. Remove the corned beef from packaging and place in the bottom of the slow cooker. Cover with beef broth (or water for a more mild flavor), and top with 2 bay leaves. Cover and cook on LOW heat for 5 hours.
 2. Add in potatoes and carrots around brisket and continue cooking on LOW heat for 3 more hours.
 3. Finally, add in the chopped cabbage on top, cover and continue cooking for an additional 30 minutes on LOW heat.
- Use tongs and a slotted spoon to remove cabbage, carrots and potatoes from slow cooker. Remove the corned beef and let rest for 5 minutes before slicing. Enjoy!

Sodium levels for this recipe are high because corned beef is brined in a salt mixture to give it its distinct flavor. You can rinse the beef prior to adding to the slow cooker and use water in place of beef broth to reduce sodium levels further.

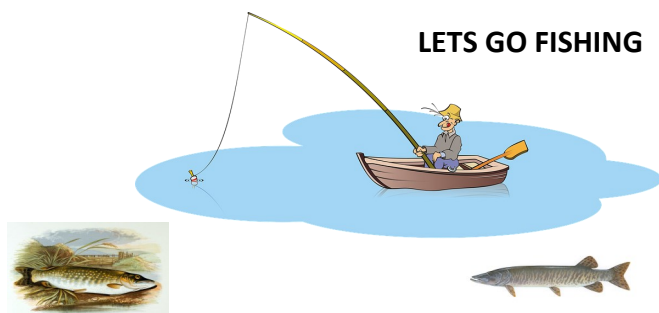
