Dear Brothers and Sisters,

happen to have found a couple old Wisconsin Odd Fellow is-

sues. As I read one of these issues, it was dated January 1939, I found an interesting article. So I am using part of it for my letter this month.

Sparta Lodge # 94 was having issues with membership. They ran a contest towards the end of the year 1938. The Noble Grand appointed a committee to

work on the contest. It was decided that the Noble Grand and Vice Grand would be captains. The committee divided up the members equally, with the members who came to meetings regularly, those attending casual-

ly, and those never attending meetings into the two teams. They gave 2 points for each meeting a member attended, 1 point for each dollar



of back dues collected, 3 points for each member visiting another lodge, and 5 points for each application brought in. After 8 weeks, the team with the most



points would win. The losing team had to provide, cook and serve the winning team an oyster supper. During the contest \$208.00 in back dues were collected, 13 new members were added and 1 reinstatement.



What if your lodge tried a contest similar to this. Maybe you have the winning team and were served a steak dinner. I know a lot of us would try to win that contest. It would also help your lodge, the Jurisdiction of Wisconsin, and the whole Order.

What if two lodges competed against each other in a contest like this?

It was an interesting article. I might have other inspirations from the past in the coming months.




So, my friends, we all need to continue working on making this world a more peaceful place to exist. Sometimes we need to soften our "wolfy" ways and become more like

### Schuyler Thomas Colfax Jr. 17th Vice President of the United States

#### Biography

Schuyler Colfax was born to Schuyler Colfax and Hannah Striker on Mar. 23, 1823 in Schodack, Rensselaer, New York. His father died from tuberculosis before his birth. Schuyler's mother, Han-nah, ran a boarding house, along with her mother. She eventually married George W. Matthews in 1834.

#### Dropped Out of School at Age 10

Schuyler attended public school in New York City until he dropped out at the age of ten to became a clerk at a store, bringing an end to his formal education. In 1836, the family moved to New Carlisle, Indiana and in 1841, to South Bend where he served for eight years as a deputy auditor for St. Joseph County under his stepfather, who was the auditor.

#### **Editor and Publisher**

He served as an assistant enrolling clerk of the state senate and also a senate reporter for the Indiana State Journal. At the age of 19, he became the editor of the South Bend Free Press which he later bought in 1845, he changed the name to St. Joseph Valley Register, which he published for 9 years. On Oct. 10, 1844, he married Evelyn Clark. They had no children and she died in 1863.

#### 29th Speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives

In 1850, Schuyler became a member of the state constitutional convention, and in 1854, he took an active part in organizing the "Anti-Nebraska men" in his state, which later, along with the northern Whigs, Know Nothings and Free Soilers, became known as the Republicans. They sent him to Congress where he served from 1855 until 1869, the last six years as speaker of the House.

#### Founder of Rebekah Degree of the IOOF

During this time, Colfax, who was a member of the Independent Order of Odd Fellow (I.O.O.F.), was appointed along with two others, to prepare a Ritual of ceremonies pertaining to the Rebekah Degree. On Sept. 1851, the degree was approved and Schuyler Colfax became its author and founder.

#### **Eulogy for President Lincoln**

Not one who was known for his eloquence, Colfax came the closest when he gave his eulogy for Abraham Lincoln:

"Murdered, coffined, buried, he will live with those few immortal names who were not born to die; live, as the Father of the Faithful in the times that tried men's souls; live in the grateful hearts of the dark-browed race he lifted from under the heel of the op-pressor to the dignity of freedom and manhood; live in every bereaved circle which has given father, husband, son or friend to die, as he did, for his country; live, with the glorious company of martyrs to liberty, justice and humanity, that trio of Heaven-born principles; live, in the love of all beneath the circuit of the sun, who loathe tyranny, slavery and wrong."

#### Vice President of the United States


In 1868, he accepted the Republican nomination as Vice President serving with General Ulysses S. Grant and was elected. Two weeks later, Schuyler married Ella M. Wade, the niece of Senator Benjamin Franklin Wade. They had one son, Schuyler Colfax III, who was born in 1870.

#### Death in Minnesota

Schuyler Colfax returned to private life and earned a living on the lecture tour. Walking between train depots in Mankato, Minnesota on Jan. 13, 1885, Schuyler Colfax died after suffering a heart attack brought on by freezing cold temperatures and exhaustion at the age of 61 yrs. He is buried in the City Cemetery at South Bend, Indiana.

#### Legacy

Colfax County, Nebraska and Colfax County, New Mexico are both named in Vice President Colfax's honor.

Whereas, because of the untiring efforts of Brother Colfax to provide a Degree for wives and daughters of Odd Fellows, the world now enjoys a Sisterhood of Lodges in twenty countries around the globe.

Therefore, I, John S. Cupp Jr., Sovereign Grand Master of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, by authority in me duly vested, do proclaim,

That the 23rd day of March 2024 be: *Schuyler Colfax Day* throughout Odd Fellowship in honor of the birthday of Brother Colfax.

Further, please observe the birthday of Brother Schuyler Colfax by initiating a *'Colfax Class'* in honor of the celebration.



B. Eligibility: a person of good character who believes in a Supreme Being, the Creator and Preserver of the Universe sponsored by a member of the Order, shall be eligible for membership.

(2) Belief in the existence of a Supreme Being who is the Creator and Preserver of the Universe, is an integral requirement to hold membership in this Order. The denial, disbelief, or inability to believe with certainty in the existence of a Supreme Being as previously mentioned is incompatible with membership in this Order.

(a) Loss of belief in the existence of aSupreme Being is conduct unbecoming anOdd Fellow.

Membership has five attributes: boundaries, emotional safety, a sense of belonging and identification, personal investment, and a common symbol system.

Membership has boundaries; this means that there are people who belong and people who do not. The boundaries provide members with the emotional safety necessary for needs and feelings to be exposed and for intimacy to develop. Creating boundaries creates a definition of who can be a part of a community and who cannot.

Emotional safety may be considered as part of the broader notion of security. Boundaries established by membership criteria provide the structure and security that protect group intimacy. Such security may be more than emotional; gangs, for example, provide physical security and collectives enhance economic security. Boundaries help create emotional safety because when members know who is in the community and why, it creates trust and an openness in conversations.

The sense of belonging and identification involves the feeling, belief, and expectation that one fits in the group and has a place there, a feeling of acceptance by the group, and a willingness to sacrifice for the group.

The role of identification must be emphasized here. It may be represented in the reciprocal statements "It is my group" and "I am part of the group." Both boundaries and a sense of emotional safety will ensure that members feel a sense of belonging. Making sure all members have a voice is important to make sure they feel like they can honestly say "this is my community". If they truly feel like they have had a hand in making the community what it is, then they will inevitably identify with that community.

Personal investment is an important contributor to a person's feeling of group membership and to his or her sense of community. Working for membership will provide a feeling that one has earned a place in the group and that, as a consequence of this personal investment, membership will be more meaningful and valuable. Personal investment plays a large role in developing an emotional connection (such as in-home ownership) and will be considered again. Every contribution from a member is important because they are investing their time and brainpower. A common symbol system serves several important functions in creating and maintaining sense of community, one of which is to maintain group boundaries. Understanding common symbols systems is prerequisite to understanding community. Groups use conventions intentionally to create social distance between members and non-members. However, symbols only work when they represent an existing dynamic of reputation and community.

Each of us should examine ourselves as to why we belong to this Order today. Does it fit our lifestyles? How can we change for the betterment of mankind and get members of our community involved?

### Crock Pot Pierogies and Sausage

Prep Time

Cook Time 8 hrs Total Time 8 hrs 5 mins

#### Ingredients

- 18 ounces frozen pierogies
- 1 pound sausage

1 can cream of chicken soup (10.5 oz)

- 1 can cheddar cheese soup (10.5 oz)
- 2 cups chicken stock
- 1 cup shredded cheddar for topping

#### Instructions

#### All Methods

1. Mix the soup and the chicken stock. Set it aside.

#### **Slow Cooker**

- 1. Butter or oil the insert.
- 2. Layer as follows: 1/2 pierogies, 1/2 sausage, 1/2 soup mixture, 1/2 cheese. Repeat.
- 3. Cover and cook: Low 6 to 8 hours; High 3 1/2 to 4.

#### **Instant Pot**

1. Place pierogies and sausage in insert with 1 cup water. Manual high 2 minutes, quick release. Drain.

2. Turn Instant Pot to sauté. Add soup-broth mixture, 1/2 the cheese and stir gently until combined. Add sausage and pierogies. Heat and stir until hot and bubbly.

3. Turn hot off. Add remaining cheese to top. Place lid on top and allow to rest for 10 minutes.

#### Oven

1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees.

2. Defrost overnight or place pierogies in a covered dish with 1/2 cup of hot water and microwave for 2 to 2 1/2 minutes. Repeat until defrosted.

3. Butter a 9x13 casserole dish. Layer: pierogies, sausage, sauce, cheese.

4. Cover and bake 25 to 30 minutes. Remove cover and bake an additional 5 to 10 minutes to lightly brown as desired.
