Dear Brothers and Sisters,

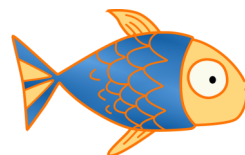
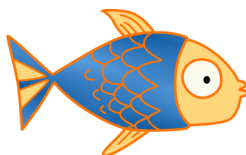
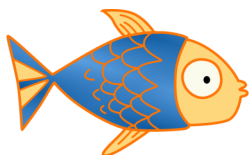

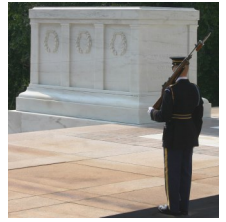


GRAND SECRETARY'S LETTER

1 John 1:8 *"If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us."*

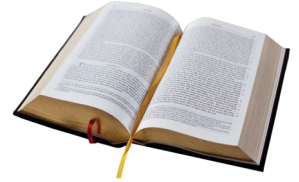

There are many references to Truth in the Bible as can be read in the examples that I have listed above. Each of you may have your own personal favorite Bible verse. Today, I would like to talk about the 1 John 3:18 quotation *"Dear children, let us not love with words or speech, but with actions and in truth."*

To me, this is exactly what Odd Fellowship is about. Talking and doing are two very different things. The more we actually do in Friendship and Love, the more Truth of what our Order stands for can be understood. While we often speak of the things that we would like to do in our Lodges and communities, how often do we actually accomplish them? In my own Lodge we have talked of many potential projects, but many have gone undone.

Those Lodges who show the Truth of our Order in their actions are likely to be the most successful in **"fishing"** for new members. I was asked several years ago to meet with our local Optimists group in Baraboo. They asked a few questions about our Lodge, the origins, etc., but they didn't have a lot of interest in what we had done in the past. They wanted more of the "now" to show them the Truth of my words. Unfortunately, the few activities we had done in the recent past were over shadowed by that of other groups in the Community.

This is the same in our interactions with other people. We can tell them one thing, but until we take action to show them the Truth in our words, they may not believe them. *Proverbs 12:22 "The LORD detests lying lips, but he delights in people who are trustworthy."* By not showing how much we really care and Love our neighbors, no matter who they are or what their beliefs may be, people may doubt our Truth. We must always be Truthful in our speech as well, being ever mindful of how our words may affect someone. *1 John 1:8 "If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us."*

The Odd Fellow creed states it this way, "as I work with others to build a better world because in spirit and in **truth**, I am, and must always be, **grateful to my Creator**, faithful to my Country, and fraternal to my fellow man; I AM AN ODD FELLOW!"

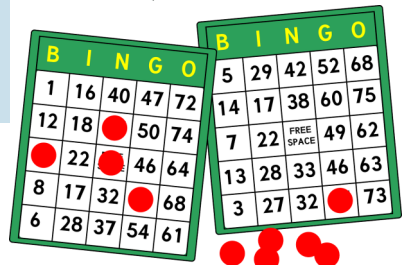

TO BE READ IN ALL LODGES:

The Odd Fellow Rebekah Home Association Inc has proposed the following changes to the by-laws of the Association:

Sec. 15.13. Number, Tenure and Qualifications. There shall be eight **ten (10)** Directors, including the Grand Master by virtue of office, and seven **nine (9)** Directors consisting of four **five (5)** Rebekahs and three **four (4)** Odd Fellows, who need not be delegates to the session. Odd Fellow and Rebekah members shall be elected for a three-year term, with the term of **at least** one Director from each unit of the Order to expire each year. This provides for continuity of the Board. Each director shall hold office until his/her successor has been elected and qualified.

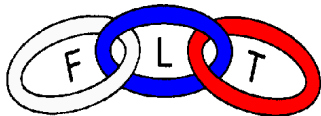

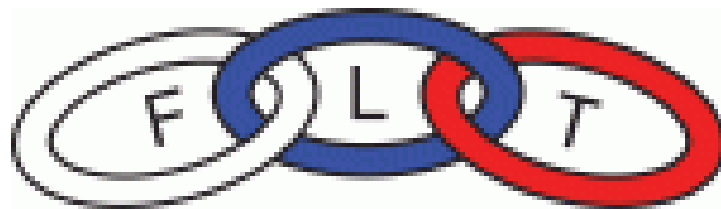
PLEASE READ IN LODGE MEETING (THANKS)

Report of Board of Directors, First Quarter Meeting @ 8:00 a.m.

February 26, 2022 - Comfort Suites

The opening prayer was given by Char Everett.

Stephenson National Bank

Jeff Bauman from Stephenson National Bank was present to give a report on the state of our Trust account and the position the managers are taking in handling the account. They are reacting to the recent invasion of Ukraine by Russia by focusing more on risk within the U.S. domestic market and less on European companies. Jeff continued that warning to not react emotionally to the current events.

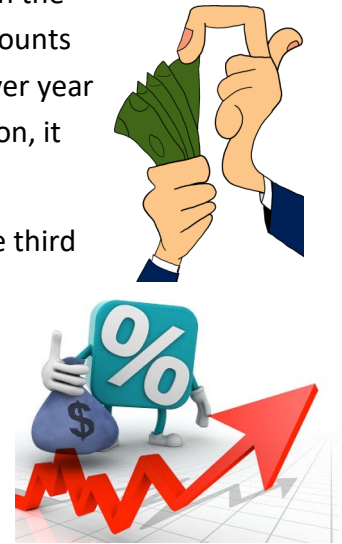
Investment planners are carefully watching China to see how it responds to the situation and China is watching how the U.S. and other countries respond to the invasion before making its move to take back Taiwan. Taiwan has a greater economic influence in the world than Russia. Because N.A.T.O. and the U.S. are more invested in the human toll than Russian leaders, sanctions are a better force than troops on the ground, although troops are probably quicker. Cyber attacks and misinformation quickly spread are also factors. Early reports were filled with misinformation. Energy prices are going to be impacted very quickly. This raises questions about inflation - how high will it go and how long will it last. Prior to the invasion, forecasts were for inflation to peak at about 7 1/2 % and start trending downward about mid 2022. Now it is likely to reach 8% and still start going down about mid-year, until it reaches a more normal 2%. Higher energy prices will act as a governor on growth. The question is how the market reacts to the invasion. If the fed raises interest rates, it is likely there will be a longer period of inflation. This may make a difference in whether the fed raises interest rates as much as market observers had originally expected. The overall picture indicates that the fed will be fighting inflation from now through 2025.



Jeff explained that from 2011 to 2019 inflation was running at or below 2%, but with the influence of stimulus money in 2020, people began purchasing goods in greater amounts sending prices higher due to supply and demand. Inflation is measured on a year over year basis, what did a product cost last year as compared to this year. Prior to the invasion, it was expected that costs would stabilize.

In looking forward to 2022, analysts see continued volatility, inflation peaking in the third or fourth quarter, fed raising interest rates three to four times, a pause in economic activity in November because of mid-term elections, and a flip in party control of the government because of dissatisfaction with the current government which will increase gridlock. These will provide a certainty for the market in making decisions for the future which will cause the market to surge.

There is a lot of volatility ahead with the war, the fed, and energy prices. By the end of the year, the unknowns will have become known and will provide a positive influence on the market. Currently, the U.S. has an older demographic which will do less purchasing from corporations. This will have an effect on inflation. Our inflation was impacted by the supply chain issues we've experienced over the past two years. There has been progress in addressing the various supply chain issues which will help alleviate the inflation issue.



Jeff Jones moved and Tom Heins seconded to approve the minutes from the January 30, 2022, meeting. Motion carried.

After a short break, Loren and Sharon Cunningham joined the meeting via phone. President Dick summarized the report that Jeff Bauman had given on Stephenson National Bank.

Operational Review of Rebekah Haven and Odd Fellow Home:

Rebekah Haven continues to hold its own with some months showing a \$2000 profit and others showing a \$1000 loss. Odd Fellow Home continues to show losses due to a very poor census, although it is beginning to improve, and added expenses due to Covid. As of this past week we had 60 out of 88 beds occupied. The problem with an improving census is that we don't have the staff to care for additional residents. We are staffed appropriately for 60 but currently we have openings for 3 full time R.N. positions. We have not had any applicants for the R.N. positions in the last month. Administration has had multiple meetings to find a solution including restructuring of job descriptions, would a better benefit programs be advisable, would another wage increase help, etc. Continued wage increases are only sustainable to a certain point. We are in a contract with Bellin to provide a nurse to oversee National Guard help so we could accept those Bellin

patients ready for discharge but who could not be placed in another facility because of the amount of care the patients require. Bellin was unable to find an applicant for the nursing position so they went to a traveling nursing program which will provide a nurse. The health care system is such that hospitals get financial penalties if they keep a patient for a number of days after their insurance authorization expires. The penalties increase as the number of days increases. The good news she had to report is that, following our most recent state survey about three weeks ago, OFH has regained the 5 star status for the first time in about three years. Char reported that Cody is proving to be an excellent administrator and is very thorough in handling resident complaints/events/occurrences which might become an I.J. He has a procedure for accepting the complaint, interviewing patient, staff and others involved and then doing an elaborate analysis of what the past non-compliance was: what happened, how it will be corrected and why it won't happen again. He provides in-service and education of staff to make them aware of how to avoid it again. Cody has a good relationship with the state.



Dick reported that our Housing Director Tami Adams has terminal cancer. She had breast cancer which has metastasized to her bones. There will be a fund raising benefit for her on April 16 at Terry's Wall Street Pub, 3361 Main St., Green Bay.



Jeff Jones moved and Pat Mott seconded to approve the QAPI report that was received by the Board at the January meeting. Motion carried.

We received a thank you note from Jamie Strohschein for the crystal memento recognition she received from the Board on her retirement.

Break from session before going into closed session.

Our next meeting will be April 29, with interviews for the CEO position to be scheduled on April 28. We will meet on Thursday evening, April 27, to go over the potential interview questions.




Tom moved and Pat seconded to adjourn. Motion carried.

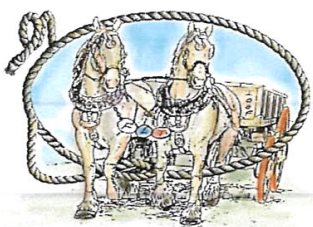

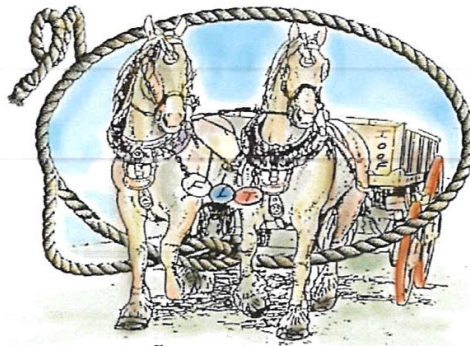

- 1+ cup Italian dressing
- 1 1/2-2 1/2 tablespoons dried salad seasoning (such as McCormick's Salad Supreme)

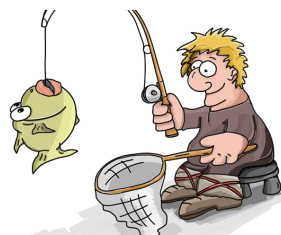

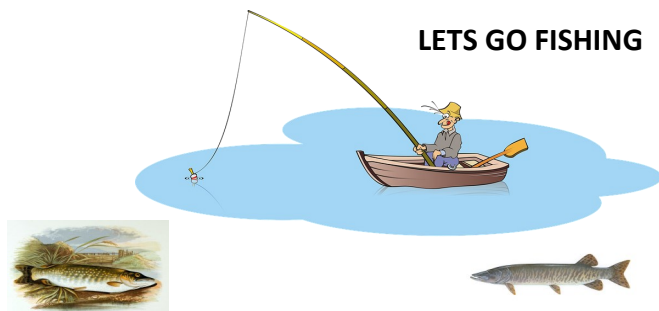
