# TO BE READ IN ALL ODD FELLOW LODGES: GRAND MASTER'S LETTER

In my **communication** with you this month, I want to let you know of one very important change that happened at Sovereign Grand Lodge Sessions. I want to make sure you all know that Chapter XXXVIII Offenses and Trials in the Code of General Laws of the I.O.O.F., otherwise known as the big green book, has been totally redone as in take the old Chapter pages out, throw those away and start all over. The first thing to know is Sovereign Grand Lodge, I.O.O.F. shall administer trials for all Units of the Order and the sec-

ond thing is this chapter goes into effect September 1, 2022. There is a moratorium for changes to this Chapter for 3 years. Sovereign Grand Lodge will cover the cost of the trial. I am hoping we do not need to use this chapter, but I also don't want anyone getting in trouble for not following the new Chapter XXXVIII.

There are other bills that were passed, but I will let the representatives tell you all about the rest of Sovereign Grand Lodge sessions.

# **Crescent Roll Apple Dumplings**

All you need is 10 minutes to prepare them, and then into the oven they go. Make these crescent roll apple dumplings next time as a surprise sweet dish for your breakfast table, or bring them over to a friend's house for brunch.

5 from 2 votes

Cook Time 35 minutes Total Time 45 minutes Servings 8

# Ingredients

- 2 cans (8 each) refrigerated crescent roll dough
- · 2 sticks of butter
- 1 1/2 cups brown sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1 can (12oz) 7 Up or Mountain Dew
- 2 large Granny Smith apples, peeled, cored, and sliced

# Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350° F. Unroll the crescent roll dough and place one slice of apple at the thickest part and roll-up.
- 2. Place the rolled dumplings in a greased baking dish.
- 3. Add the butter, vanilla, cinnamon, and brown sugar to a small saucepan over medium heat and melt the butter and stir everything together.
- 4. Pour the melted butter mixture over the dumplings.
- 5. Pour the can of 7-UP around the dumplings (not on top) and bake in the oven for 35 minutes.
- 6. Serve immediately.


